- Advisors should evaluate progress of students and their career/major choices on a continuing basis
- Advisors should help student become familiar with advising resources available
- Advising requires clear communication

- Successful advising is linked to strong retention (NACADA Handout)






- Regularly scheduled office hours posted in numerous places


