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Since 1985, the Child and Family Resource Council has been a leader in child abuse and neglect prevention.

Through advocacy, coordination, and education, we protect children from the devastating effects of abuse and neglect, we support families

through innovative programs, and we strengthen our community by using collaboration to achieve our mission: to shape a community that protects children from abuse and neglect.

#### **Protecting Children**

Mandated Reporter Training Professionals who are required by law to report suspected cases of child abuse and neglect can attend a specially-designed learning session. Participants learn about child protection laws, how to make reports to Child Protective Services, and community resources that are available to families.

RAVE (Resources Against Violent Encounters) Through peer dramas, in-school, and after-school demonstrations, high-school and middle-school students learn pathways to healthy relationships. Presentations model healthy relationships through prevention education, awareness, and advocacy.

Shaken Baby Syndrome Training These sessions are an overview for parents and childcare providers (babysitters, church groups, daycare providers) on the signs, symptoms, and contributing factors of Shaken Baby Syndrome. They also learn positive coping strategies to calm a crying infant.

#### **Supporting Families**

Connections Helps parents of children ages four months to five years track their child's development and identify potential developmental delays. Parents receive developmental surveys and newsletters, age appropriate activities, and are linked to community resources as needed.

Kent County Healthy Start Helps all first-time parents in Kent County access the information and resources they need for the challenges that comes with parenting. Support is available through home visits, phone calls, play groups, and educational materials.

**Encouraging Family Foundations (EFF)** Offers a parenting and life-skills classes to unmarried parents of infants or those who are expecting. Topics include budgeting, balancing family and work, effective co-parenting and communication skills.

#### Strengthening Our Community

**Advocacy** The Council continuously builds a network to educate local, county and state legislators about protecting children from abuse and neglect. The *Our Children, Our Future: Standards* (think of them as a child's Bill of Rights) (pg.19) guides our advocacy efforts.

### **Our Children, Our Future: Standards**

In 1993, a group of caring citizens and people who work in child and family services joined together to articulate the values and standards of a familyfriendly community. These were published in a booklet called Our Children, Our Future: Standards for Kent County Kids.

These values and standards serve as a guiding beacon as well as a source of inspiration for families and all health, human service, and educational organizations in Kent County.

Excerpts from Our Children, Our Future:

#### We feel strongly that...

All of our children should grow up in a community that takes individual as well as collective responsibility and is accountable for the health development and well-being of its children and youth. This should be a community that is determined to act upon shared beliefs and goals for our children, whether at home, school, church, work or elsewhere.

All of our children should be valued as critical assets and resources in the community. Their value should be reinforced by positive, consistent and continuous visual, oral and experiential messages. It should be evident in behaviors, attitudes, policies, programs and opportunities at home, school, church or place of worship, work, media and public places that validate their important place in the community and create a sense of hope for their future.

#### We believe that all of our children in Kent County should....

#### At Birth:

- 1. Be wanted and cared for by a mature and nurturing adult(s) who is responsible and is accountable for the child's well-being.
- 2. Have received appropriate, comprehensive prenatal care, including community resources that are affordable, accessible, responsive and sensitive to diverse cultural needs.

#### After birth and throughout childhood and youth:

- 1. Have love, nurturing and encouragement from at least one caring, stable and responsible adult.
- 2. Have food that is nutritionally sound and provided three times daily.
- 3. Have clothing and clothes that are clean, warm and in good condition.



- 4. Have a home that is clean, safe and affordable.
- 5. Receive quality support services in health, human services and education that are affordable, accessible, and culturally appropriate and sensitive.
- Have safe, secure environments with adequate, quality supervision at home, and in school, day care, neighborhoods, parks and public places throughout the community.
- Have equal opportunities for quality early childhood education that is affordable and accessible.
- Have equal opportunities for significant and meaningful educational, employment and enrichment experiences regardless of race or economic status.
- 9. Have frequent opportunities to learn life skills that reinforce the development of self-esteem, self-respect and self-reliance.
- 10. Have opportunities to better understand and appreciate our pluralistic world through multicultural curriculums and personal experiences, and from adults who demonstrate their understanding of and sensitivity to diverse cultures.
- 11. Have parent(s) or guardian(s) who work in settings where families are a priority and where family policies support the well-being of employees' children.
- 12. Have opportunities to be supported emotionally, physically, mentally and spiritually by a community of faith.
- 13. Be exposed to a positive and hopeful future through radio, television, music and other media that portray responsible, nonviolent, caring, productive and constructive behaviors and attitudes among peers and role models.

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## When You Don't Feel Like Singing: The "Baby Blues"

After pregnancy, hormonal changes in a woman's body may trigger symptoms of depression. Depending on the severity, this is called postpartum depression or the "baby blues." During pregnancy, the amount of two female hormones, estrogen and progesterone, increases greatly. In the first 24 hours after childbirth, these hormones rapidly drop back to their normal, pre-pregnancy levels. Researchers think this rapid change may lead to depression. Other factors may also contribute to feelings of postpartum depression:

- Feeling tired after delivery; broken sleep patterns and not enough rest often prevents a new mother from regaining her full strength for a few weeks.
- · Feeling overwhelmed with a new or additional baby to care for and self-doubt about being a good mother.
- Feeling stress from changes in work and home routines.
- Feelings of loss loss of identity of who you are, or were, before having the baby; loss of control; loss of your pre-pregnancy figure; and feeling less attractive.
- Having less free time and less control over time.

The baby blues can occur in the days right after childbirth and normally go away within a few days to a week. Symptoms such as sudden mood swings, sadness, crying spells, loss of appetite, sleeping problems, and feeling irritable, restless, anxious, and lonely are not severe and treatment generally isn't needed. See the sidebar of things you can do to feel better.

Postpartum depression can arise anytime within the first year after childbirth. The difference is that postpartum depression often affects a woman's wellbeing and prevents her from normal functioning for a longer period of time. Postpartum depression needs to be treated by a doctor.

Some women don't tell anyone about their symptoms because they feel embarrassed, ashamed,

#### Helpful Tips for the "Baby Blues":

- · Get as much rest as you can. Try to nap when the baby naps.
- Stop putting pressure on yourself to do everything. Do as much as you can and leave the rest!
- Ask for help with household chores and nighttime feedings. Ask your husband or partner to bring the baby to you so you can breastfeed. If you can, have a friend, family member, or professional support person help you in the home for part of the day.
- Talk to your husband, partner, family, and friends about how you are feeling.
- Do not spend a lot of time alone. Get dressed and leave the house. Run an errand or take a short walk. Participate in a mothers' group with your child.
- Spend special time with just your husband or partner.
- Talk with other mothers, so you can learn from their experiences.
- Join a support group

or guilty about feeling depressed when they are supposed to be happy. Perinatal depression can happen to any woman. It does not mean you are a bad mom. You and your baby don't have to suffer. There is help.

Speak to your doctor or midwife if you are having symptoms of depression while you are pregnant or after you deliver your baby. Your caregiver can help assess your situation, recommend treatment options, and refer you to a medical professional who specializes in treating depression.

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# Prime Time: Helping Children Learn, Grow and Thrive

Toddlers are busy little people. Exploring the nooks and crannies of their environment, they delight in their discoveries. It's not hard to imagine a two year old on the prowl in the living room as her father relaxes on the sofa with a newspaper. "Shoe!" she proudly announces, holding the found object aloft like a trophy. Dad lowers the paper and smiles at his daughter. "Yes, that's daddy's brown shoe. Can you find the other shoe?"

Child development specialists call this "elaborating," adding on to a child's words. A simple, intuitive interaction, this type of exchange is how we help children build their vocabulary and learn to speak. It's just one small example of how adults foster brain development and early learning in young children.

In the first years of life, a child's brain grows faster than at any other time, laying the foundation for a lifetime of learning. In recent decades, much has been learned about how the architecture of a child's brain is formed and the impact stress can have on processing information and interacting with others.

The "wiring" of a child's brain occurs in direct response to the environmental input a child receives after he or she is born. By the time children enter kindergarten, a great deal of the emotional and intellectual wiring of their brains has been set. Whether children are on a path leading to academic success and positive social behavior or to school failure and violence is determined largely by the manner in which this wiring has occurred.

As infants receive appropriate stimulation, brain cells called neurons begin to branch out and become denser. The majority of this growth occurs most quickly and easily from birth to age three, when normally developing children learn to speak, think, and perform sophisticated movements and build interpersonal relationships. Conversely, an impoverished environment diminishes brain development.

Early care provides the experiences that have decisive and lasting effects on the emotional, social, behavioral, intellectual and physical capabilities of a child for the rest of his or her life. Following are just a few tips about what parents and caregivers

## To promote optimal child brain development, parents and caregivers can:

- Be consistent, responsive and provide safe routines and surroundings
- Cuddle and hold babies
- · Talk and read daily to babies
- Vary babies' environments during the day
- Have toys for babies to squeeze, teethe, suck, grasp, push and pull
- · Provide nutritious foods
- · Get well-child check ups
- Schedule and keep developmental screenings as advised by your doctors
- As the child grows, provide materials such as stacking and nesting toys, lacing materials, musical instruments, finger paint, and crayons
- · Create opportunities to make choices
- Praise appropriate behavior and set limits consistently
- Model good behaviors
- Encourage safe exploration
- Play word games, read sing, and expand on children's words
- Promote good health habits and dental hygiene
- · Maintain routines with flexibility

## Sleep Safe for Your Baby

It's important to know—babies can die when they are put to sleep in places that are not safe. Babies always need a safe place to sleep, even for just a short nap.

Infants can be accidentally smothered by those who sleep with them, like parents or children, or when they sleep in overstuffed sofas or heavily blanketed adult beds. Place your baby in a crib or bassinet to sleep to help prevent suffocation accidents.

It is now known that babies sleep safest when they are on their backs. Many deaths occur when babies who are used to sleeping on their backs are put to sleep on their tummies by a caregiver unfamiliar with the baby's sleeping routine. You can reduce your baby's risk of dying by telling caregivers to always place your baby on his or her back to sleep.

The American Academy for Pediatrics also suggests offering your baby a pacifier at naptime and bedtime. Current studies show pacifier use during a baby's first year contributes to a safe sleep environment. Do not reinsert the pacifier if your baby refuses it or it falls out during sleep. Pacifiers should be delayed for breastfeeding babies until one month of age to ensure breastfeeding is well established.

When babies are awake, they need "tummy time" to aid their physical development. Tummy time should also be done only when someone is with the baby and watching. If the baby falls asleep during tummy time, place the baby on his or back in a safe place to continue sleeping.

#### Safe sleep steps:

Put baby to sleep by him or herself in a crib, portable crib, or bassinet. Babies are not safe sleeping with other children, adults or pets.

Always put baby to sleep on his or her back, even when he/ she can roll over.

Make sure nothing is in the sleep area: no pillows, comforters, stuffed animals or other soft things. Warm sleeper suits are preferred over blankets; however, if a light blanket is needed, tuck all sides of the blanket in between the mattress and crib sides along bottom half of crib, below baby's arms.

Don't overheat the baby. Dress your baby in as much or as little clothing as you are wearing.

Don't allow anyone to smoke anything around your baby.

Adult beds are not safe for babies. Sleeping with a parent or other children, and using heavy blankets can potentially can lead to suffocation. A good practice is to place the baby's crib or bassinet near your own bed. This makes it easy to feed your baby and then return your baby to the crib for safe sleeping.

#### A safe crib has:

A firm, tight-fitting mattress and sheet

No loose, missing, or broken hardware or slats.

No more than 2 3/8 inches of space between the slats (width of a soda can).

No corner posts over 1/6" high

No cutout designs in the headboard or footboard.

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## **Positive Parenting**

Parenting isn't easy. But with love, limits, and lots of involvement, parents are able to raise happy, healthy and well-behaved children. Following are a few tips for resolving conflicts and setting limits with your child while nurturing a positive relationship.

Read the child's cues. Many confrontations can be avoided if you pay close attention to your child's behavior and see the signs he is already agitated, tired, or uncomfortable for some reason. What may seem like random misbehavior probably has causes you can address, if not solve altogether.

Redirect the behavior. As soon as you see trouble coming, offer an alternative. A four-year old can likely understand and accept a simple explanation, such as, "I'm afraid I can't let you do that, because Billy is still taking his turn. You can work with the blocks, or help me with a snack instead. Which will it be?"

**Offer a choice.** Offering your child a choice is a good way to avoid confrontation and helps your child learn how to make good choices. Be sure to offer a limited number of choicesstart with two—and only offer those you can accept and fulfill. Offer choices that your child can distinguish as different. For example, if you're headed out on an errand and your child starts to object, you might say, "We are going to the store now; would you like to take your Panda Bear or your Big Bird book to look at?" Now the child is focused on his choice, not the inevitable trip.

Remove the child from the situation, or the toy or object from the child. When things heat up, it's time to move on to something else or put away the object. Later, when the situation calms down, you may be able to demonstrate how to play with the toy or do the task appropriately. If you can keep the child right at your side for a time while he starts something else - all the better.

Reflect his feelings back to him. Show him you acknowledge and understand the anger or frustration that may have accompanied an incident. It's good if you can prompt him to express his feelings verbally, but it doesn't have to become an issue if he doesn't. When you acknowledge his frustration, you are not waiving the consequences of what he's done, just recognizing what's behind it. Complete the communication by stating what's wrong with the behavior, and an alternative, such as, "I know it's frustrating when the markers are all dry, but when you throw them on the floor like that, it's just a mess we have to pick up. Let's do that now, and then find something else you can work with, like these crayons."

If you do have to give him a "time out" to help both of you calm down, you can usually give him the choice to return to his activities, "only when you are ready to work within the rules." When possible, put the "time out" spot right near you - your presence is likely to have a calming effect.

This program is facilitated by trained professionals and used to educate adolescents about dating violence, sexual harassment and assault, the media's influence on gender role stereotyping, and how to build healthy relationships.

The RAVE curriculum is designed to prevent youth from resorting to acts of violence, coercion, and/or abuse by teaching healthy boundaries, communication and conflict resolution skills. It is also serves to educate youth who have begun to exhibit or experience signs of abuse and/or violence within their own interpersonal relationships.

RAVE offers this program free to schools and after-school or summer programs serving youth 12-19 years of age. Each of the 8 interactive sessions lasts about an hour. 

# **Internet Safety for Kids**

- Personal information stays personal. Teach kids not to share passwords or give up information.
- Help them find a balance between computing and other activities.
- For younger kids (pre 7th grade) try to keep the computer in a shared family space. For older kids who need to work in their own space make sure you pop your head in often and see what they're up to.
- Learn about computers so you can enjoy them together with your kids.

- Talk to your kids about where they go online and ask them to show you things.
- 6. Make sure that your children feel comfortable coming to you in the event that there's an online problem. If they worry that you'll take away their computers or blame them for causing trouble they won't come to you until it's too late.
- Keep kids out of chat rooms unless they are monitored.
- Have them sign an acceptable use policy and let them know they'll lose computer privileges if they abuse rules.
- Know their online friends, buddies, and who they email. Know the sites they visit.
- 10. Warn them that things said on the Internet take on a life of their own and travel very quickly.
- 11. Warn them not to take on roles and personae like "I'm a 12 year old boy named Billy" when they're not.
- Warn them to be suspicious of people they don't know who lure them into a conversation and ask too many details.
- Own the master account with your online service.
   As the master account holder you can use the parental control tools that are part of most services.
- 14. Know what they do at their friends' houses, especially on the Internet.



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# Why Are Childhood **Vaccines So Important?**

It's true that newborn babies are immune to many diseases because they have antibodies they get from their mothers. However, the duration of this immunity may last only a month to about a year. Further, young children do not have maternal immunity against some vaccine-preventable diseases, such as whooping cough.

If a child is not vaccinated and is exposed to a disease germ, the child's body may not be strong enough to fight the disease. Before vaccines, many children died from diseases that vaccines now prevent, such as whooping cough, measles, and polio. Those same germs exist today and a small number

of children are hospitalized right here in our community for vaccine-preventable diseases like meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B. Because vaccines are so successful, we do not see these diseases often; however it is important not be lulled into a false sense of security. Immunizations are very important to the health of a child and the health of everyone in the community.

In the past few years, there have been reports that some parents and families of children with autism believe that the Measles/Mumps/ Rubella (MMR) vaccine caused their children's autism. The National Institutes for Health (NIH) reports that there has been no conclusive, scientific evidence that any part of a vaccine, nor any combination of vaccines causes autism. Nor is there conclusive data that any type of preservative (i.e., thimerisol) used during the manufacture of vaccines plays any role in causing autism or other health concerns. Thimerisol is no longer used as a preservative in the making of vaccines. In 2001, the Institute of Medicine (IOM) and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) released findings from their separate reviews of the available evidence on a possible link between vaccines and autism. Both groups found, independently of one another, that existing evidence does not support such a connection.

Locally, the Kent County Health Department has six clinic locations throughout the county where immunizations may be obtained for children and adults. All clinics are open Monday through Friday, however hours vary by location. Free and lowcost vaccines are available to qualifying families. 


